General Information

Membership Requirements and Cost:

Membership is open to youth in grades 1 - 12 from any community. Yearly club dues are \$50 per child. Financial aid is available upon request and proper paperwork being completed. We do not turn any child away due to financial concerns.

Tours: Parents and children are encouraged to take a tour of the Club prior to becoming a member. Please call the Club for more information or to set up a tour. Tours can be taken at 11 AM on Tuesdays or 6 PM on Thursdays.

School Vacation/Holidays/Early Dismissal:

Pre-registration is required for these days, as the club adjusts its schedule according to the Amesbury, Newburyport, and Triton school district calendars. A \$10 fee will be charged per half-day and \$20 per full day.

Club I.D: All members will receive a Club Card. Each time he/she enters or exits the Club the card must be scanned. First card is free, each additional card is \$1.
